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## **AUTHORITY**

**Authority to adopt and amend this Schedule was transferred from the Industrial Accident Commission to the Administrative Director, Division of Industrial Accidents on January 15, 1966.**

**Labor Code Section 4660, as amended effective January 15, 1966, provides:**

**4660. (a) In determining the percentage of permanent disability, account shall be taken of the nature of the physical injury or disfigurement, the occupation of the injured employee, and his age at the time of such injury, consideration being given to the diminished ability of such injured employee to compete in an open labor market.**

**(b) The administrative director may prepare, adopt, and from time to time amend, a schedule for the determination of the percentage of permanent disabilities in accordance with this section. Such schedule shall be available for public inspection, and without formal introduction in evidence shall be prima facie evidence of the percentage of permanent disability to be attributed to each injury covered by the schedule.**

**(c) Any such schedule and any amendment thereto or revision thereof shall apply prospectively and shall apply to and govern only those permanent disabilities which result from compensable injuries received or occurring on and after the effective date of the adoption of such schedule, amendment or revision, as the fact may be.**

**Pursuant to this authority, the Administrative Director has adopted the Schedule for rating Permanent Disabilities of the Industrial Accident Commission as in force on January 14, 1966.**

**The Schedule was originally adopted effective January 1, 1914. This copy was reproduced in June 1966, and contains all amendments to the Schedule as of that date.**

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE OF SCHEDULE FOR RATING PERMANENT DISABILITIES

*Rules Applying to Cases in Which the Disability and Occupation Are Covered Specifically by the Schedule:*

- (1) Determine nature of disability, occupation, and age at time of injury.
- (2) Refer to "List of Disabilities and Standard Ratings" (beginning on page 2) to determine disability number and standard rating.
- (3) Refer to "List of Occupations and Occupational Group Numbers" (beginning on page 16) to determine occupational group number.
- (4) Refer to "Column for Disability-Occupational Combination" (beginning on page 35) to determine the column in which the disability is rated for the occupation under consideration.
- (5) Refer to "Standard Range of Ratings" (page 63) to determine, under the appropriate column, the rating for the disability in the occupation under consideration as compared with the standard rating, at age 39.
- (6) Refer to "Variation for Age in Ratings for Disability-occupation Combinations" (beginning on page 65) to determine the final rating for the age under consideration as compared with the rating at age 39. The numbers to the right of the colon represent quarters of one percent.

**Example:**

- (1) Nature of disability — Major arm lost above elbow, prosthesis used satisfactorily.
- Occupation — Carpenter (construction).
- Age at time of injury — 35
- (2) The disability is found on page 5, the disability number is found to be 7.121, and the standard rating is 70%.
- (3) The occupation is found on page 18, and the occupational group number is found to be 31.
- (4) Referring to page 42, the rating for disability number 7.121 in group number 31 will be found in column H.
- (5) Referring to standard range of ratings, page 64, a standard rating of 70% becomes 75% in column H.
- (6) Referring to page 67, the 75% is located in the left hand column and reading across to the column for ages 34 and 35 the final rating of 74% is found.

*General Rules Applying to Cases in Which Disability and/or Occupation Are not Covered Specifically by the Schedule: (Note 1)*

Evaluate non-scheduled disabilities (A) by comparison with the nearest scheduled disability, (B) by analogy to a scheduled disability, or (C) by comparison with the entire scheme of relative severity of disabilities.

Apply the following rule to any non-scheduled disability which is related to a starred (\*) scheduled disability.

- (1) Determine a standard rating for the non-scheduled disability, adjusted to the nearest whole percent.
- (2) Modify such standard rating for occupation and age in accordance with rules 3, 4, 5, and 6 above.

Note (1) — Since it is impossible to include all disabilities in a schedule, the list of disabilities is designed to provide guides for the rating of disabilities which commonly occur. Omission of a disability from this schedule does not necessarily signify that it is not ratable.

When an occupation occurs which is not listed in the schedule by the identical title and industrial designation, it may be that such occupation is listed under an alternate title. If it is not so listed, it will be necessary to determine the basic functions and activities of such occupation and relate it to a scheduled occupation which is comparable, to determine the appropriate group number.

## GUIDELINES FOR WORK CAPACITY

1-A

These apply to pulmonary, heart disease, abdominal weakness and spinal disabilities.

GUIDELINES g) AND h) MAY APPLY TO LOWER EXTREMITY DISABILITIES. (x)

**a) Disability Precluding Very Heavy Lifting**

contemplates the individual has lost approximately one-quarter of his pre-injury capacity for lifting.

(A statement "inability to lift 50 pounds" is not meaningful. The total lifting effort, including weight, distance, endurance, frequency, body position and similar factors should be considered with reference to the particular individual.)

**b) Disability Precluding Very Heavy Work**

contemplates the individual has lost approximately one-quarter of his pre-injury capacity for performing such activities as bending, stooping, lifting, pushing, pulling and climbing or other activities involving comparable physical effort.

**c) Disability Precluding Heavy Lifting**

contemplates the individual has lost approximately half of his pre-injury capacity for lifting.

(See statement regarding lifting under a) above.)

**d) Disability Precluding Heavy Lifting, Repeated Bending and Stooping**

contemplates the individual has lost approximately half of his pre-injury capacity for lifting, bending and stooping.

**e) Disability Precluding Heavy Work**

Contemplates the individual has lost approximately half of his pre-injury capacity for performing such activities as bending, stooping, lifting, pushing, pulling, and climbing or other activities involving comparable physical effort.

**f) Disability Resulting in Limitation to Light Work**

contemplates the individual can do work in a standing or walking position, with a minimum of demands for physical effort.

**g) Disability Resulting in Limitation to semi-Sedentary work**

contemplates the individual can do work approximately one half the time in a sitting position, and approximately one half the time in a standing or walking position, with a minimum of demands for physical effort whether standing, walking or sitting.

**h) Disability Resulting in Limitation to Sedentary Work**

contemplates the individual can do work predominantly in a sitting position at a bench, desk or table with a minimum of demands for physical effort and with some degree of walking and standing being permitted.

(x) This amendment applies to injuries occurring on or after January 1, 1973.

This amendment applies to injuries occurring on or after January 1, 1970.

**To obtain standard rating where only one work function impairment exists:**

- (1) Refer to Chart above.

**To obtain standard rating where multiple work function impairments exist:**

- (1) For impairments within Group I, use the greatest value plus one-half the sum of the lesser values.
- (2) For impairments within Group II, use the greatest value plus one-fifth the sum of the lesser values.
- (3) For impairments within both groups, combine Steps (1) and (2) using the formula:

$$\text{Group I Total} + \left[ \left[ .45 - \left( \frac{\text{Group I Total}}{300} \right) \right] \times \text{Group II Total} \right]$$

- (a) The result obtained shall be taken at not less than that obtained in Step (2).
- (4) Round off only the final result obtained in Step (1), (2), or (3). Round only to the values of 1, 2, 3, 5, 8, 10, 13, 15, and multiples of 5% thereafter.

**When warranted by facts and evidence, a deviation from the foregoing may be employed.**

- (4) OCCUPATIONS WHICH OCCUR WITHOUT BASIC VARIATION IN A LARGE AND INDETERMINABLE NUMBER OF INDUSTRIES BUT CANNOT BE READILY IDENTIFIED WITH A GENERAL TYPE OF ACTIVITY ARE ASSIGNED THE INDUSTRIAL DESIGNATION "ANY INDUSTRY", AS CRANE OPERATOR (ANY IND.); TRUCK DRIVER (ANY IND.); STATIONARY ENGINEER (ANY IND.). THE DESIGNATION "ANY INDUSTRY" IS NOT MEANT TO BE A CATCH-ALL FOR ALL OCCUPATIONS HAVING THE SAME TITLE WHICH OCCUR IN INDUSTRIES NOT LISTED IN THE SCHEDULE FOR THAT OCCUPATION. THE CRITERION FOR DESIGNATING AN OCCUPATION AS "ANY INDUSTRY", IS THE SIMILARITY OF FUNCTION AND ACTIVITY OF THE OCCUPATION IN A LARGE NUMBER OF INDUSTRIES, IN WHICH THE OCCUPATION DOES NOT FALL WITHIN A GENERAL TYPE OF ACTIVITY AS IN NO. 2 ABOVE.

INDUSTRIAL DESIGNATIONS ARE NOT MEANT TO BE RESTRICTED TO THOSE OCCUPATIONS LISTED IN THE SCHEDULE. AN OCCUPATION BEARING THE SAME TITLE AS ONE LISTED, BUT OCCURRING IN A DIFFERENT INDUSTRY, MAY BE CONSIDERED TO BE THE SAME AS THE SCHEDULED OCCUPATION, IF IT HAS BEEN DETERMINED THAT THE FUNCTIONS AND ACTIVITIES ARE BASICALLY THE SAME. THUS, PUNCH PRESS OPERATOR (BOILERMAKING) IS THE SAME AS PUNCH PRESS OPERATOR (FORGING; LOCO. & CAR BLDG. & REP.) TO ATTAIN A MAXIMUM DEGREE OF UNIFORMITY IN OCCUPATIONAL AND INDUSTRIAL TITLES AND TERMINOLOGY, EXTENSIVE USE HAS BEEN MADE OF "THE DICTIONARY OF OCCUPATIONAL TITLES" COMPILED BY THE U. S. DEPARTMENT OF LABOR WHICH IS USED NATIONALLY FOR THIS PURPOSE.

COOPERAGE MANUFACTURING & REPAIR - PRODUCTION AND REPAIR OF BARRELS OF ALL KINDS, BUCKETS, TANKS, AND OTHER CONTAINERS MADE OF STAVES.

CORDAGE AND TWINE MANUFACTURING - PRODUCTION OF ROPE, CORDAGE, AND TWINE FROM ANY CLASS OF TEXTILE.

CORN PRODUCTS MANUFACTURING - PRODUCTION OF VARIOUS PRODUCTS FROM CORN.

COTTONSEED PRODUCTS MANUFACTURING - PRODUCTION OF VARIOUS PRODUCTS FROM COTTONSEED.

DAIRY PRODUCTS MANUFACTURING - COLLECTION FROM FARMS AND PASTEURIZING OF MILK AND CREAM; PROCESSING OF BUTTER, CHEESE, CONDENSED AND EVAPORATED MILK; AND RETAIL AND WHOLESALE DISTRIBUTION OF DAIRY PRODUCTS.

DISTILLED LIQUOR MANUFACTURING - PRODUCTION OF DISTILLED AND BLENDED LIQUORS.

DOMESTIC SERVICE - RENDERING OF SERVICE IN PRIVATE HOMES.

DRUGS, TOILET PREPARATIONS, AND MEDICINE MANUFACTURING. PRODUCTION OF DRUG PREPARATIONS, PHARMACEUTICALS, PATENT MEDICINES, AND TOILET PREPARATIONS.

FELT GOODS MANUFACTURING - CONVERSION OF RAW MATERIALS, SUCH AS HAIR, JUTE, RAPE, AND WOOL INTO FELT.

FLAVORING EXTRACT AND FLAVORING SYRUP MANUFACTURING - PRODUCTION OF FLAVORING EXTRACTS, SYRUPS, AND FRUIT JUICES FOR SODA-FOUNTAIN USE.

FORGING - SHAPING OF HEAVY METAL BY HEATING AND HAMMERING OR PRESSING; OR BY COLD HAMMERING OR PRESSING.

FOUNDRY - PRODUCTION OF METAL CASTINGS IN SAND MOLDS.

GARMENT MANUFACTURING - PRODUCTION FROM FABRIC OF VARIOUS TYPES OF GARMENTS.

GLASS MANUFACTURING - PRODUCTION FROM RAW MATERIALS OF GLASS, AND GLASS PRODUCTS AS WINDOW GLASS, PRESSED WARE, AND BLOWN WARE, INCLUDING BOTTLES.

ICE PRODUCTS — PRODUCTION OF ICE BY ARTIFICIAL REFRIGERATION.

LAUNDRY — WASHING, DRYING, IRONING, AND MENDING OF WEARING APPAREL AND HOUSEHOLD ARTICLES IN COMMERCIAL LAUNDRIES OR IN LAUNDRY DEPARTMENTS OF HOTELS, ETC.

LEATHER MANUFACTURING — CURRYING, FINISHING, AND TANNING OF HIDES AND SKINS.

LEATHER PRODUCTS MANUFACTURING — PRODUCTION OF LEATHER ARTICLES, EXCEPT BOOTS AND SHOES.

LIBRARY — SERVICES RENDERED IN ALL TYPES OF LIBRARIES, INCLUDING LIBRARIES OF EDUCATIONAL AND OTHER ESTABLISHMENTS.

LIGHT, HEAT, AND POWER — GENERATION, TRANSMISSION, AND DISTRIBUTION OF ELECTRICITY; DISTRIBUTION OF MANUFACTURED AND NATURAL GAS; PRODUCTION AND DISTRIBUTION OF STEAM HEAT AND POWER.

LINOLEUM MANUFACTURING — PRODUCTION OF INLAID, PRINTED, AND PLAIN LINOLEUM AND RELATED FLOOR COVERINGS.

LOCOMOTIVE AND CAR BUILDING AND REPAIR — BUILDING, REBUILDING, AND REPAIRING OF RAILROAD CARS AND LOCOMOTIVES.

LOGGING OPERATIONS — CUTTING OF TREES; TRANSPORTATION OF LOGS TO SAWMILLS OR PULP MILLS; AND PREPARATION, IN THE FOREST, OF MINE TIMBERS, RAILROAD TIES, STAVE BOLTS, AND OTHER FOREST PRODUCTS.

MACARONI AND RELATED PRODUCTS MANUFACTURING — PRODUCTION OF DRIED FLOUR PRODUCTS AS MACARONI, NOODLES, ETC.

MACHINE SHOP — MACHINE SHOPS, INDEPENDENTLY OPERATED OR IN CONJUNCTION WITH OTHER OPERATIONS, DOING JOB, REPAIR, OR PRODUCTION WORK. DOES NOT INCLUDE OCCUPATIONS PECULIAR TO INDIVIDUAL INDUSTRIES OR HIGHLY REPETITIVE WORK OF LIMITED SCOPE OCCURRING IN MASS PRODUCTION INDUSTRIES.

MALT LIQUOR PRODUCTION — PRODUCTION OF MALT LIQUORS AS ALE, BEER, ETC.

MATCH MANUFACTURING — PRODUCTION OF MATCHES OF ALL KINDS.

MATTRESS AND BEDSPRING MANUFACTURING — PRODUCTION OF MATTRESSES AND BEDSPRINGS, INCLUDING PRODUCTION AND ASSEMBLY OF COIL SPRINGS, MATTRESS COVERS, AND OTHER PARTS.

MEDICAL SERVICES — PROFESSIONAL SERVICES RENDERED IN TREATING AND CARING FOR SICK AND INJURED PERSONS AND ANIMALS, INCLUDING NON-PROFESSIONAL SERVICES IN SUCH ESTABLISHMENTS AS HOSPITALS.

MINING — EXTRACTION OF MINERALS FROM THE EARTH, INCLUDING UNDERGROUND, SURFACE, AND OPEN PIT OPERATIONS.

MIRROR AND PICTURE FRAME MANUFACTURING — PRODUCTION OF PICTURE FRAME MOLDINGS, FRAMES FOR MIRRORS, PICTURES, ETC., AND FRAMED PICTURES.

MODEL AND PATTERN MANUFACTURING — PRODUCTION OF HAT BLOCKS, DRESS, AND SHOW FORMS, MANNEQUINS, WAX FIGURES AND SIMILAR COMMODITIES.

MOTION PICTURE PRODUCTION — PRODUCTION OF MOTION PICTURES, INCLUDING PHOTOGRAPHING OF SCENES, DEVELOPMENT OF FILMS AND OTHER NECESSARY STUDIO AND LABORATORY WORK. DOES NOT INCLUDE ACTORS, ACTRESSES OR ENTERTAINERS, OR DISTRIBUTION AND PROJECTION OF FILMS IN THEATERS, ALL OF WHICH ARE INCLUDED IN AMUSEMENT AND RECREATION.

MOTOR VEHICLE TRANSPORTATION — OPERATION OF ALL TYPES OF PUBLIC MOTOR VEHICLE TRANSPORTATION FOR PASSENGERS AND FREIGHT.

NONFERROUS METAL ALLOYS AND PRODUCTS MANUFACTURING — PRODUCTION, ROLLING AND DRAWING OF NONFERROUS METAL ALLOYS, AND THE PRODUCTION OF FINISHED NONFERROUS ALLOY AND METAL PRODUCTS NOT ELSEWHERE COVERED.

NUT PROCESSING — SHELLING, CLEANING, ROASTING, BLEACHING, POLISHING, AND PACKAGING OF ALL KINDS OF NUTS EXCEPT COCONUTS.

OPTICAL GOODS MANUFACTURING — GRINDING OF LENSES AND PRODUCTION OF OPTICAL GOODS.

ORE DRESSING, SMELTING, AND REFINING — DRESSING, SMELTING, AND REFINING OF NONFERROUS METAL ORES, INCLUDING THE ENTIRE PROCESS FROM CRUDE ORE TO FINISHED PRODUCT.

PAINT AND VARNISH MANUFACTURING — PRODUCTION OF PAINTS, VARNISHES, LACQUERS, ENAMELS, PIGMENTS, ETC.

PAPER AND PULP MANUFACTURING — PRODUCTION OF PULP AND PAPER, MOLDED PULP GOODS, AND PAPERBOARD OF ALL KINDS, INCLUDING SURFACING AND FINISHING OF PAPER.

PAPER GOODS MANUFACTURING — PRODUCTION OF PAPER AND CARDBOARD PRODUCTS, AS BOXES, ENVELOPES, PAPER BAGS, ETC.

PETROLEUM REFINING INDUSTRY - REFINING OF CRUDE PETROLEUM BY DISTILLATION AND THE OPERATION OF STORAGE FACILITIES.

PIPE-LINE OPERATIONS - OPERATION OF OIL AND GAS PIPE LINES, INCLUDING OPERATION OF PUMPING STATIONS AND MAINTENANCE OF PIPE LINES.

PLANING MILL INDUSTRY - SURFACING AND SIZING OF LUMBER, INCLUDING SHAPING AND ASSEMBLY OF WOODEN PARTS.

PLASTIC PRODUCT MANUFACTURING. (SEE FABRIC. PLASTIC PROD. MFG.)

POTTERY AND PROCELAIN WARE INDUSTRY - PRODUCTION OF CLAY PRODUCTS AS CHINA-WARE, EARTHENWARE, AND PROCELAIN WARE, INCLUDING VITREOUS CHINA, PLUMBING FIXTURES, AND ELECTRICAL INSULATORS.

PRINTING AND PUBLISHING INDUSTRY - PRINTING AND PUBLISHING OF NEWSPAPERS, PERIODICALS, BOOKS AND OTHER PRINTED MATTER, INCLUDING THE DESIGN, COLORING AND RELATED PROCESSES. ALSO INCLUDED ARE PREPARATION OF STEEL AND COPPER PLATES AND WOOD CUTS FOR PRINTING PURPOSES.

PROFESSIONAL AND KINDRED SERVICES - PROFESSIONAL, SEMI-PROFESSIONAL AND HIGHLY TECHNICAL SERVICES WHICH CANNOT BE ALLOCATED TO ONE INDUSTRY. THESE OCCUPATIONS REQUIRE EXTENSIVE STUDY OR EXPERIENCE AND ARE PREDOMINANTLY MENTAL IN CHARACTER RATHER THAN MANUAL.

QUARRYING, AND SAND AND GRAVEL INDUSTRY - EXTRACTION FROM THE EARTH AND PREPARATION OF STONE, ROCK, SAND AND GRAVEL USED PRIMARILY FOR CONSTRUCTION PURPOSES, MONUMENTS, ETC.

RADIO BROADCASTING INDUSTRY - CREATION AND BROADCASTING OF RADIO AND TELEVISION PROGRAMS, INCLUDING PREPARATION AND DIRECTION OF MUSICAL PROGRAMS AND PLAYS, MAKING ELECTRICAL RECORDINGS, OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF BROADCASTING EQUIPMENT, SALES OF PROGRAMS TO SPONSORS, AND BROADCASTING OF SPECIAL EVENTS.

RADIO AND TELEVISION MANUFACTURING INDUSTRY - PRODUCTION OF RADIO AND TELEVISION RECEIVING SETS, LOUDSPEAKERS, TUBES, AND RADIO PARTS AND ACCESSORIES.

RAILROAD TRANSPORTATION INDUSTRY - OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE OF RAILROADS, RAILROAD EQUIPMENT AND ALLIED SERVICES, AS SLEEPING AND DINING CAR SERVICE AND RAILWAY EXPRESS. STEAM, ELECTRIC, AND DIESEL RAILROADS AND STREET AND SUBURBAN RAILWAYS ARE COVERED. DOES NOT INCLUDE MAJOR REPAIRS CARRIED ON IN SHOPS. (SEE LOCO. & CAR BLDG. & REP.)

RAYON AND ALLIED PRODUCTS INDUSTRY - PRODUCTION OF RAYON YARN AND ALLIED PRODUCTS. DOES NOT INCLUDE PRODUCTION OF TEXTILE FABRICS AND PRODUCTS FROM RAYON YARN WHICH IS INCLUDED IN THE TEXTILE INDUSTRY.

REAL ESTATE - OPERATION OF REAL ESTATE OFFICES AND FUNCTIONS OF REAL ESTATE AGENTS, BROKERS, AND DEALERS, INCLUDING REAL ESTATE DEVELOPMENT (NOT INCLUDING CONSTRUCTION), ESTATE MANAGEMENT, OPERATION, OWNERSHIP, AND RENTAL OF PROPERTY AND, THE BUYING AND SELLING OF REAL PROPERTY.

REFRIGERATOR AND REFRIGERATING AND ICE-MAKING EQUIPMENT INDUSTRY - PRODUCTION OF ICE BOXES AND REFRIGERATING AND ARTIFICIAL ICE-MAKING EQUIPMENT. INCLUDES PRODUCTION OF COMPLETE AIR-CONDITIONING UNITS.

RETAIL TRADE - SALE OF GOODS TO ULTIMATE CONSUMERS AND SERVICES INCIDENTAL TO THE SALE OF GOODS.

ROOFING MATERIALS INDUSTRY - PRODUCTION OF ROOFING AND ROOF COATINGS OTHER THAN PAINT. DOES NOT INCLUDE PRODUCTION OF WOODEN SHINGLES, WHICH IS INCLUDED IN THE SAWMILL INDUSTRY.

RUBBER GOODS INDUSTRY - PRODUCTION OF ALL TYPES OF RUBBER ARTICLES, INCLUDING RUBBERIZED FABRICS. DOES NOT INCLUDE TIRES AND TUBES. (SEE RUBBER TIRE & TUBE MFG.)

RUBBER RECLAMING INDUSTRY - RECLAMATION OF RUBBER FROM DISCARDED AND SCRAP RUBBER.

RUBBER TIRE AND TUBE INDUSTRY - PRODUCTION OF RUBBER TIRES AND TUBES AND RETREADING OF TIRES. TIRE RETREADING IN REPAIR SHOPS IS INCLUDED IN AUTOMOTIVE SERVICES INDUSTRY.

SAWMILL INDUSTRY - PRODUCTION OF COOPERAGE STOCK, LATHS, ROUGH LUMBER, SHINGLES, AND VENEER STOCK. DOES NOT INCLUDE PRODUCTION OF VENEER OR PLYWOOD. (SEE VENEER & PLYWOOD MFG.)

SCREENS AND WEATHER STRIP INDUSTRY - PRODUCTION OF WINDOW AND DOOR SCREENS AND WEATHER STRIP OF ANY MATERIALS. DOES NOT INCLUDE PRODUCTION OF WIRE SCREENING. (SEE WIREWORK PROD.)

SHAPED WOODEN ARTICLES - PRODUCTION OF TURNED AND SHAPED WOODEN ARTICLES AND WOODEN GOODS NOT ELSEWHERE CLASSIFIED.

SHEET METAL WORK - FABRICATION, ERECTION, AND INSTALLATION OF SHEET METAL APPLIANCES OR EQUIPMENT. MATERIALS USED INCLUDE LIGHT GAUGE SHEET COPPER, BRASS, TIN, ZINC, AND GALVANIZED IRON.

SHIP AND BOAT BUILDING AND REPAIRING INDUSTRY - CONSTRUCTION AND REPAIR OF WATERCRAFT OF ANY KIND.

SIGNS AND ADVERTISING NOVELTIES INDUSTRY - PRODUCTION AND INSTALLATION OF NEON, ELECTRIC, AND OTHER TYPES OF SIGNS AND PRODUCTION OF VARIOUS TYPES OF ADVERTISING NOVELTIES. DOES NOT INCLUDE LITHOGRAPHED AND PRINTED SIGNS.

SLAUGHTERING AND MEAT PACKING INDUSTRY - SLAUGHTERING OF CATTLE, HOGS, SHEEP, AND OTHER ANIMALS; PREPARATION AND PACKING OF MEAT PRODUCTS; AND DRESSING AND PACKING OF POULTRY, RABBITS, AND OTHER SMALL GAME.

SOAP AND GLYCERIN INDUSTRY - PRODUCTION OF SOAP, SOAP PRODUCTS, AND GLYCERIN.

STONE WORKING INDUSTRY - CUTTING, FINISHING, AND SHAPING OF STONE OF ALL KINDS AS MARBLE, GRANITE, AND SLATE FOR BUILDING, MONUMENTAL AND ORNAMENTAL PURPOSES.

STRUCTURAL AND ORNAMENTAL METAL WORK - SHOP FABRICATION OF STRUCTURAL AND ORNAMENTAL METAL WORK FOR BUILDINGS AND BRIDGES.

SUGAR INDUSTRY - PRODUCTION AND REFINING OF BEET OR CANE SUGAR AND MOLASSES.

SURGICAL AND ORTHOPEDIC APPLIANCES INDUSTRY - PRODUCTION OF SURGICAL APPLIANCES OTHER THAN SURGICAL INSTRUMENTS, INCLUDING ARTIFICIAL LIMBS, BELTS, TRUSSES, AND BRACES.

TELEPHONE AND TELEGRAPH INDUSTRY - MAINTENANCE AND OPERATION OF COMMUNICATION SYSTEMS FOR WIRE AND RADIO TRANSMISSION OF MESSAGES.

TEXTILE BAG INDUSTRY - PRODUCTION OF TEXTILE BAGS, AS JUTE OR CANVAS.

TEXTILE MANUFACTURING INDUSTRY - SPINNING OF ALL TYPES OF THREAD AND YARN; AND THE WEAVING, DYEING, AND FINISHING OF ALL TYPES OF TEXTILE FABRICS. DOES NOT INCLUDE MANUFACTURE OF RAYON YARN OR PROCESSES PECULIAR TO PRODUCTION OF CARPETS AND RUGS.

TIN CAN AND OTHER TINWARE INDUSTRY - PRODUCTION OF TIN CANS AND OTHER TINWARE, AS PAILS AND WASHTUBS, EXCEPT PRESSED TINWARE.

TOBACCO INDUSTRY - STEMMING OF TOBACCO AND PRODUCTION OF CIGARETTES, CIGARS, CHEWING TOBACCO, SMOKING TOBACCO, AND SNUFF.

TRIMMINGS AND STAMPED ART GOODS INDUSTRY - PRODUCTION OF BIAS BINDING, CROCHETED GOODS, DRESS, COAT, AND MILLINERY TRIMMINGS, HEMSTITCHING, PLEATING, AND STAMPED ART GOODS.

VENEER AND PLYWOOD INDUSTRY - PRODUCTION OF VENEER AND PLYWOOD.

VINOUS LIQUORS INDUSTRY - PRODUCTION AND BOTTLING OF WINES. DOES NOT INCLUDE GROWING OF FRUIT FROM WHICH WINES ARE MADE. (SEE AGRIC.)

WATER TRANSPORTATION INDUSTRY - LOADING AND UNLOADING OF CARGOES AT WHARVES; OPERATION OF SHIPS, BARGES, FERRIES, TURBOBOATS, AND OTHER VESSELS ENGAGED IN TRANSPORTING FREIGHT AND PASSENGERS BY WATER.

WATERWORKS - STORING, FILTERING, PURIFYING, AND DISTRIBUTION OF WATER FOR DOMESTIC AND INDUSTRIAL USE AND THE OPERATION OF WATER-SUPPLY SYSTEMS FOR IRRIGATION PURPOSES.

WHOLESALE TRADE - SELLING TO RETAILERS, INSTITUTIONS, INDUSTRIAL CONSUMERS OR OTHER WHOLESALE ORGANIZATIONS FOR RESALE OR OTHER PROCESSING RATHER THAN FOR FINAL CONSUMPTION.

WINDOW SHADE AND FIXTURES INDUSTRY - PRODUCTION OF CURTAIN POLES, FIXTURES, RODS, VENETIAN BLINDS, WINDOW SHADES, AND WINDOW SHADE ROLLERS, AND FIXTURES. DOES NOT INCLUDE SCREENS AND WEATHER STRIP. (SEE SCREEN & WEATHER STRIP MFG.)

WIRE DRAWING - DRAWING OF WIRE FROM BARS OR RODS.

WIREWORK INDUSTRY - FABRICATION OF METAL WIRE INTO SUCH PRODUCTS AS BARBED WIRE, WIRE ROPE AND CABLE, WIRE SPRINGS, AND WIRE FENCE.

WOODEN BOX INDUSTRY - PRODUCTION OF WOOD SHOOTS, CASES, CRATES, AND BOXES, EXCEPT CIGAR BOXES.

WOOD PRESERVING INDUSTRY - PRODUCTION AND PRESERVING OF WOODEN PAVING BLOCKS, CONDUITS, AND POLES; AND PRESERVING OF RAILROAD TIES AND TIMBERS FOR OTHERS.

WOODWORKING - FABRICATING, GRADING, PLANING, SAWING, AND SHAPING OF LUMBER AND WOODEN ARTICLES, EXCEPT SUCH PROCESSES WHICH ARE CONSIDERED TO BE PECULIAR TO SPECIFIC INDUSTRIES. (SEE FURN. MFG.; PLAN. MILL OPERATIONS OR OTHER INDUSTRY.)

## COMBINING MULTIPLE DISABILITIES

### A. FOR DISABILITIES INVOLVING DIFFERENT PARTS OF BODY

FOR THE PURPOSE OF THIS SECTION THE TERM "MULTIPLE DISABILITIES" REFERS TO DISABILITIES INVOLVING DIFFERENT MEMBERS OR ORGANS OF THE BODY (FOR INSTANCE DISABILITY IN AN ARM, THE BACK, AND A LEG). THE TERM DOES NOT REFER TO MULTIPLE DISABILITY FACTORS IN A SINGLE EXTREMITY NOR BILATERAL DISABILITIES (SUCH AS DISABILITY IN BOTH LEGS).

IN RATING MULTIPLE DISABILITIES AS ABOVE DEFINED, IT IS FIRST NECESSARY TO COMPUTE THE RATING WHICH WOULD APPLY TO EACH COMPONENT DISABILITY AS IT WOULD RATE IF IT STOOD ALONE. THESE RATINGS ARE THEN ARRANGED IN ORDER OF MAGNITUDE. FIRST, TAKE THE RATING FOR THE MAJOR DISABILITY. IT IS THEN ASSUMED THAT THE REMAINING CAPACITY WILL EQUAL 100% MINUS THE RATING FOR THE MAJOR DISABILITY. THEREFORE, THE RATING FOR THE SECONDARY DISABILITY IS APPLIED TO THIS REMAINING CAPACITY AND THE RESULTING PERCENTAGE ADDED TO THE RATING FOR THE MAJOR DISABILITY. THE COMBINED RATING FOR THE TWO DISABILITIES IS THIS SUM PLUS 10% OF THE RATING FOR THE SECONDARY DISABILITY. RATINGS FOR ADDITIONAL DISABILITIES CAN BE COMBINED SUCCESSIVELY WITH THE COMBINED RATINGS FOR OTHER DISABILITIES, APPLYING THE SAME METHOD. FINAL RATING MAY NOT EXCEED 100%. THE TABLE ON THE FOLLOWING PAGE CAN BE USED INSTEAD OF PERFORMING THE COMPUTATION IN EACH INDIVIDUAL CASE.

THE RESULT OBTAINED BY SUCH CALCULATION IS NOT NECESSARILY TO BE ADOPTED AS THE FINAL RATING FOR COMBINED DISABILITIES BUT SHOULD SERVE AS A GUIDE ONLY. THE FINAL RATING WILL BE THE RESULT OF CONSIDERATION OF THE ENTIRE PICTURE OF DISABILITY AND POSSIBILITY OF EMPLOYABILITY.

### B. FOR DISABILITIES IN SINGLE EXTREMITY

#### COMBINING DISABILITIES IN A SINGLE EXTREMITY

1. APPLY SCHEDULE TO EACH DISABILITY SEPARATELY.
2. TAKE LARGEST SINGLE RATING DETERMINED BY STEP 1 AND ADD APPROXIMATELY 1/2 OF THE SUM OF REMAINING RATINGS, CONSIDERING SCHEDULED RATINGS.
3. FACTORS INVOLVING PAIN, ETC., MAY BE GIVEN ADDITIONAL CONSIDERATION TAKING INTO ACCOUNT SCHEDULED RATINGS IN THE EXTREMITY.

ALSO TRANSFER THIS PAGE AND PAGE 62 FROM SUPPLEMENT TO APPENDIX OF SCHEDULE.

NOTE: THE PURPOSE OF THIS TRANSFER IS TO ELIMINATE MULTIPLE DISABILITY CONSIDERATION FROM THE FOLLOWING RESTRICTION APPEARING ON PAGE 75 "The information appearing in this Supplement is for general guidance only and is not an integral part of the Schedule".

### C. FOR DISABILITIES IN BOTH EXTREMITIES

#### RATING FOR BILATERAL DISABILITY

(For Corresponding disability in opposite extremities such as both knees, both ankles, both elbows, etc.)

- e) USE TOTAL OBTAINED IN STEP d) AS NUMERATOR AND TOTAL OBTAINED IN STEP b) AS DENOMINATOR AND APPLY THIS FRACTION TO RATING OBTAINED IN STEP a).

TABLE FOR DETERMINING MULTIPLE DISABILITY RATINGS

THE RATING FOR THE MAJOR DISABILITY WILL BE LOCATED IN THE TOP ROW, AND THE RATING FOR THE SECONDARY DISABILITY IN THE LEFT HAND COLUMN. THE RATING FOR THE COMBINED DISABILITY WILL BE FOUND IN THE SPACE WHERE THIS ROW AND COLUMN INTERSECT. FOR EXAMPLE, A MAJOR DISABILITY RATING OF 60% AND A SECONDARY DISABILITY RATING OF 30% WILL RESULT IN A RATING OF 75% FOR THE COMBINED DISABILITY. A THIRD DISABILITY RATING OF 20% CAN BE COMBINED WITH THE 75% RATING FOR THE FIRST TWO DISABILITIES IN THE SAME MANNER, AND THE COMBINED RATING FOR THE THREE DISABILITIES WILL BE FOUND TO BE 82%.
